
Young Justice Transformers inspired us

Subgranting





We launched our second subgranting scheme, supporting two organisations, SAPI in Bulgaria and Terre des hommes in Romania empowering young people in contact with the justice system.

We held the second Child Justice Caravan, in November in Strasbourg, France, where Young Justice Transformers met with advocacy experts and European policymakers



Impactful results


